

June Board Meeting Highlights

We began the fiscal year (Oct. 1, 2009), with the official membership registered with Kiwanis International as 189. Membership as of April Board meeting is 185.

Resignations: Mark Urick. Termination: Jack Brendel, deceased. Transfer to the Toano Club was granted to Pete Childs, who is unable to attend Wednesday meetings but will be able to attend Toano's meetings on Tuesdays.

Caren Schumacher and Wade Quinn were elected as delegates to the International Convention and Penny McClellan and Hugh Siggins as alternates.

Kiwanis International has discontinued the New Member Add Fee and replaced it with a pro-rated membership fee.

President Caren thanked the Charity Ball Committee for the wonderful event. Rick Lodwick has agreed to serve as Fund Raising Chair. Rick is recruiting committee members.

Lieutenant Governor Scott Zimmerman reported on the formation of a new club at Fort Eustis. The Denbigh Club will sponsor the Fort Eustis Club. Denbigh has extended an invitation to other clubs in the Division to co-sponsor the Fort Eustis Club. The responsibilities of a co-sponsor are: recruit members for the Club and mentor the Club for at least one year after it is formed. Our club will serve as a co-sponsor club, with Scott Zimmerman, Carla Morin, and Hugh Siggins serving on the New Club Building Team for the Fort Eustis Club. Zimmerman requested that a member of the Club's Board of Directors serve on the committee.

Rolf Kramer reported on the grants process. The Executive Committee and the Grants Committee Chairman are working on a new Club Policy for next year. The goal is to bring a draft proposal to the June Board Meeting for discussion with the final proposal approved at the July Board Meeting. Rolf asked members to submit their suggestions to him.

The Treasurer's report indicated as of April 30, the balance in the administrative account is \$13,945; the service account is \$10,683.91. The treasurer reported that to date there are no receipts for Kiwanogram advertising. The Treasurer will contact Don Buckless. Bill Unaitis and Caren Schumacher are looking at marketing opportunities for the Kiwanis hats and sweatshirts.

Elizabeth Friel's application for membership was accepted. Membership in the club has fallen by four members since the October 1, 2009. The Membership Committee recommends that the club emphasize membership until the end of the year.

Siggins announced that Unaitis has agreed to serve as the Hampton Roads Region Representative to the District Publicity Committee.

Bill Rosier is updating the website for Shrimp Feast. Several pictures and articles have been submitted to the *Virginia Gazette* as well as an op-ed piece. "The Next Door Neighbors" publication included an interview with Ray Adams regarding the Kiwanis Club of Williamsburg.

The Social Committee reported that 127 registered for the Kiwanis Picnic. Gary Ripple reported that the Foundation joined the Chamber of Commerce for the coming year. The Wilbur Davis KIDS program was kicked off at the May 13 meeting. The goal is to increase participation of Club members over last year. We have a \$5,000 challenge grant to meet and an overall fundraising goal of \$15,000 for the fiscal year. As of April 30 the endowment was \$244,060.

Jim Geiger in a written report stated that three members manned the USO facility at the Newport News/Williamsburg Airport.

Twenty members worked the concession stand at Home-A-Rama to raise funds for Kids Priority One. Four members continue to volunteer at the Grove Christian Outreach Food Pantry.

Tom French reported that for the month of April the combined number of CKI and Key Club service hours is 1,625. Total for the year is 12,833. The College of William and Mary CKI took in 11 new members bringing total membership to 62, making them the largest CKI Club in the District.

Kramer reported that to date we have received 17 grant requests. Grant requests are due by June 1.

Chris Kerner reported that to date we have 13 corporate sponsors and one company considering becoming a sponsor.

The net profit from the Charity Ball will be approximately \$7,500. Comments on the new format were favorable. The Shrimp Feast will run from 3 to 6 p.m. and the price will remain the same.

Nathan Hill is working with the new Hornsby Middle School to establish a Terrific Kids program.
