Funds From This Year's Shrimp Feast To Assist 3 "Headliner" Groups

Ever mindful of Kiwanis' trademark phrase, "Serving the Children of the World," our Club's Board this year voted to identify three of this year's most deserving local charities to be the "headliners" for this year's Shrimp Feast, and will receive in equal parts the proceeds from the ticket sales.

The three organizations are Head Start, Colonial Casa, and Bacon Street.

The Board discovered during its discussions that people who support our activities, such as the Shrimp Feast, like to know which specific organizations their purchase is supporting. Based on research by club members, it appears that organizations that focus their fund-raising efforts on a select number of organizations are able to raise more monies than those that raise money for multiple organizations, or do not specify the organizations they are assisting. Several important criteria were used to narrow down the selection of local organizations we wanted to support, such as amount of impact it would have on the organization, and whether the organization serves children in a life-sustaining manner.

The Club will, of course, continue to fund a number of sustaining grants to several organizations, but this approach defines a departure from our existing grant procedure to a process that is more manageable and meaningful. Watch for more info about grants in future articles.

Today's Speaker: Jack Greenhalgh

Jack has had a very successful career as a businessman and entrepreneur, having founded and presided over several businesses. Today, he speaks to us in his role as a board member on Honor Flight Historic Triangle, an organization of volunteers that takes World War II veterans to see the National World War II Memorial in Washington, D.C.

He earned his bachelor's degree in naval engineering at the U.S. Naval Academy in 1960 and a master's degree in business at Stanford University in 1968. The first 20 years of his career was as a U.S. Navy Supply Corps officer, serving in numerous locations including Norfolk, Illinois, Vietnam and New London, CT. During his Navy service, he

earned a Navy Achievement Medal and three Navy Commendation medals.

In 1981, he co-founded and was executive vice president of AMSEC, ultimately achieving annual sales of \$40 million in eight years. AMSEC has since become one of Hampton Roads' largest firms in its industry, with more than 5,000 employees.

In 1989, he founded Adjuvare Inc. and stayed until 2004, during which he engaged in package software development for resale. He also co-founded Energy Consultants Inc. and New Era Energy Inc. He currently serves as president of the Heritage Corporation of Virginia Inc., which he also founded in 1989.
