

Today's Speaker: Dr. Aaron De Groft

Dr. De Groft received his undergraduate degree in art history from The College of William and Mary in 1988 and a master's in art history and museum studies with a specialty in contemporary American painting from the University of South Carolina. As an Appleton Fellow, he received his Ph.D. in art history from Florida State University with a specialty in European art from the 15th through the 19th centuries. He has also studied Italian Renaissance and Baroque art history in Florence, Italy.

He has held professional curatorial and teaching positions at McKissick Museum at the University of South Carolina, at Florida State

University, at the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art, and at the Cummer Museum of Art & Gardens in Jacksonville, FL. His current research and publishing interests are in Old Master European art including work on Titian, Peter Paul Rubens and a number of other Italian artists. De Groft is also engaged in focused work on the Gilded Age, and American collectors of Old Master paintings, including a major forthcoming book on John Ringling, the American circus and business entrepreneur who built one of the most significant European painting collections in the world and then left it to the people of Florida as his grand legacy.

Bill grew up in the small town of Batavia, N.Y., southeast of Buffalo, where he graduated and joined the U.S. Air Force in 1980. While in the Air Force, he attended St. Leo's College where he earned a bachelor's degree and Central Michigan University, where he earned a master's degree in administration.

After 20 years, five U.S. assignments and two overseas assignments, Bill retired and joined the civilian workforce. For the past 10 years, he has worked for Wal-Mart, Lowe's, and two manufacturers in the Hampton Roads area as a logistics and warehouse manager. Earlier this year, Bill started a consulting company focusing on leadership and coaching.

He is married and has two adult children: A son living in Richmond and a daughter living in Williamsburg. Bill volunteers weekly with DreamCatchers.

He returned to Williamsburg in 2005. Under De Groft's leadership the Muscarelle has grown in membership, programming and exhibitions. De Groft's philosophy of "Museum as Laboratory" has also served well to better integrate the museum into the daily life of the college.
