Today's Speaker: Ray Owens

Raymond E. Owens, III, research advisor and senior economist, has been on the research staff at the Richmond Federal Reserve Bank since 1983. He has headed the Bank's regional economics section and currently serves as a research advisor and senior economist as well as a member of the Bank's monetary policy group.

In his role in policy, Ray focuses on analyzing national and regional economic conditions. In addition, he has published his research in economic policy and urban economics in top academic journals. He has long supported transparent communication of Fed activities and so maintains close contact with the business community and public.

Joe has been a Virginian most of his life. He graduated from Granby High School in Norfolk in 1970 and while there was president of Key Club. He graduated from the University of Virginia both as an undergraduate and from medical school, then continued his training in internal medicine at the University of Kentucky where he was chief resident.

He returned to Virginia to live in 1980 and hasn't left since. He did a fellowship in cardiology at MCV and then entered private practice as an interventional cardiologist in Southside Tidewater. He practiced

primarily at Chesapeake Regional Medical Center and Sentara Heart Hospital. His role as a cardiologist includes preventing heart disease, performing angiography and placing stents. He was a part of the heart transplant program for about 8 years.

After 28 years as an interventional cardiologist and after having been president of his practice, Joe wanted to develop other skills and was offered the opportunity to serve as vice president for Medical Staff Affairs at Sentara Regional Medical Center. His role there involves assuring that patients have a safe, high quality health care experience. He has special responsibilities surrounding physician credentialing and behavior.

Joe's family consists of his wife, Mary, who works in commercial real estate for Harbor Group International, and six children and stepchildren. His outside interests include exercise, fishing, photography and motorcycling.
