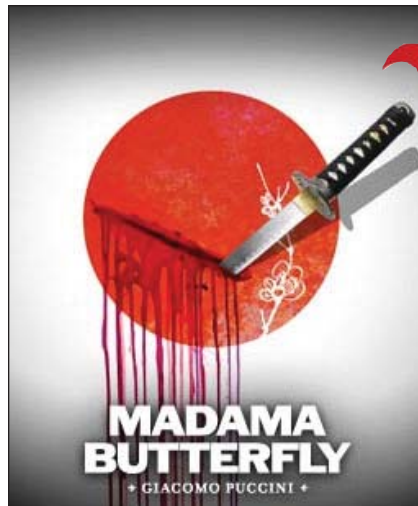

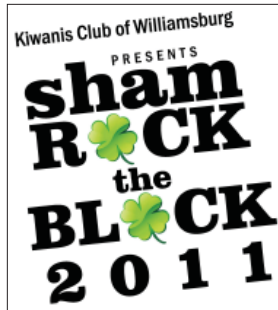
5 to 7 p.m. Please let me know the day and time you would be willing to volunteer. I will organize everything, all you need to do is show up and sell concessions or set up the fields.
