Thanks to Greg Granger and the studios at WMBG-AM 740, club member Hal Giesecking has had a chance to interview eight of our members about their WWII memories. These interviews, lasting nearly seven hours, have been edited down to a 30 minute video tape. Project coordinator Bill Unaitis has added some of the veterans' personal pictures, along with archived Internet WWII pictures, to tell their story.

Two of our members were quite athletic in their younger days. One played basketball for Holy Cross and another was an all-American swimmer.


carrier, dodging snipers in Belgium and about Wally's first parachute jump.

One talks about his skills with five languages and how he had to stay in Europe three more years working on war crimes documents.

Another talks about being a Jew, living in Germany and his experiences in labor and concentration camps.

Bill Unaitis says, "When I now look over at the 'veterans table,' I see young men, new friends. Men who had their dreams interrupted by the war."

Granger made WMBG available for interviews; Gieseeking conducted interviews; Unaitis brought the project to fruition.

"They were proud of what they accomplished but they rarely discussed their experiences, even with each other. They became, once again, ordinary people, the kind of men and women who have always been the foundation of the American way of life. For many, the war years were enough adventure to last a lifetime."


Garvey Memorial Soccer Tourney is March 16-18

Reading This Week at James River


